Impact Story

Our focus this season for families is on how to keep your home and make it warm. In December, Community Partners provided II families with financial assistance, helping them reduce their stress levels and focus on making memories together.

More than \$5,800 was spent addressing emergency needs. Three families received help with their rent, four received help to avoid utilities being shut off, three families received new beds, and two families received needed safety items and bus passes to make it through the month.

Impact Story

What would you do if you became a parent of five children overnight? Who would you call? How would you feed them, get beds, toys, clothes, Christmas gifts and pay your bills? Community Partners received a referral for a parent who drove across the country to bring their children to Indiana when they were on the brink of entering foster care after their other parent was unable to provide care for them. Community Partners connected this parent to resources they never knew existed to help in a time of need and kept them from an open case with the Department of Child Services. The family received a food voucher from a food bank, referral for furniture and beds, glasses for one son, water and gas bills paid by two local agencies and Christmas presents donated by another foundation. When communities respond as partners, children and families thrive.

When a single mom found herself in an unsafe living situation, she sought help from Daybreak to safely place her 3 year old living with autism. He was placed in a safe environment for a week while mom was connected with Community Partners and found a temporary housing solution. Through their use of Daybreak, this family was connected to resources and the mom was able to spend Christmas in a safe environment with her son. They will continue to work with SCAN to get mom back on her feet.
