Community Partners has traditionally been able to purchase mattresses for families when needed through Community Partners concrete funds but recently FCC received a grant to purchase the bedding and bed frames. This has been a great partnership between SCAN and FCC so families can

A Glance At SCAN's Region 4 Impact

Impact Story

A Healthy Families worker began working with a family with parents in their early twenties. Initially, Mom was not very present or responsive and didn't tend to respond appropriately to her girls. Mom was also very consumed with her relationship with Dad who didn't live with her. He was cheating, had stolen money, and, eventually, became violent with her.

Throughout their time with SCAN, Healthy Families has worked very hard with this mom on Parent Child Interaction (PCI). Today, baby is about 18 months and Mom's PCI has improved dramatically. Mom is way more present and responsive to her girls. In the beginning, baby was showing signs of delay due to lack of interaction. Now baby is doing great and talking up a storm. Mom has moved on from Dad and is so much happier and less stressed.



92% of families in Healthy Families successfully created a Family Goal Plan 53% of families in our Healthy Families program showed improved parental functioning. 23 outreach activities done with clients of Daybreak Crisis Homes.

Impact Story - Community Partners Region 4

Community Partners received a referral for a pregnant mother of three children who needed help housing her family. She had been living in a home where the landlord was attempting to evict her for issues that were not her fault, making living conditions very uncomfortable. She was forced to move out and find alternate housing. This mother had to guit her job to have her baby so CP assisted her with financial education and Nurturing Parenting curriculum for parenting. CP was able to provide a pack n play for her newborn, clothes, baby items, and Christmas gifts for her other three children. CP also replaced her outside door so the family could remain safe in their new home.



Local Prevention Dollar Updates

Region 3:

Many families receive parenting support through Community Partners. One father in particular had a former way of parenting using the 1,2,3 strategy, and this did not work with his child. He was able to learn a different parenting technique to give a clear, calm instruction. When his child doesn't comply, he applies a consequence like quiet time or time out. Then, when he repeats the instruction, his child complies. He has also learned to use a lot of positive language and "You Can" statements. Parenting takes time and patience to find what works for each child and this father has been diligent to find success!



Region 4:

Local Prevention agencies reached 166 children and 98 adults in November through prevention efforts of after-school programming, education on domestic violence, home safety, suicide prevention, substance abuse prevention, teen parenting, and adult parenting.

Impact Story - Community Partners Region 6

Community Partners has been working with a single mother of two for several months, walking alongside her as she processed a lot of stress dealing with divorce, the death of a parent and a serious medical diagnosis for one of her children. She needed support in navigating financial resources, since she had to limit her income caring for her child. She had never signed up for things like food stamps, and she didn't know what resources were available to her in her community. She is closing services in a more stable condition in all aspects of her life. She said she appreciated the support of someone coming weekly to talk through decisions and wants to self-refer again in the future.





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
