SCAN was joined at this event by several other community agencies who provided information and resources to those who came. Toward the end of the event, we realized we would have healthy lunch items left over. To make sure families could continue to benefit from this event, we quickly made arrangements with two different food pantries in South Bend to donate these supplies!

As we were packing up, several children came into the building to use the restroom. SCAN staff invited them to come into the event room and take some of the food items that were left. These children were so excited to receive these healthy snacks and choose the things they liked best. Eventually, their grandmother came in and we loaded her up with bags of fresh fruit and healthy snacks for her family. The SCAN team put a lot of work into planning and carrying out this event and were discouraged by a less than large turnout. However, the interaction with these children and their grandmother at the very end of a long day served as a reminder of why we continue the work that we do. Making a difference in the lives of families with children, even in a small way, makes events and days like this worth our time and effort.

#### **Local Prevention Dollar Update**

Wellspring Interfaith Social Services receives LPD funding for their after school program. September outcomes show that 37 students met or exceeded outcomes with 64% of participants improving academic performance and 36% maintaining performance. Thank you Wellspring for helping children succeed in school!

Another funded partner, the YWCA met with 148 Central Noble students to learn about the prevention of domestic violence and showed a 98% increase in knoweldge!



### **Prevent Child Abuse Councils**

#### **Allen County**

The Allen County PCA met this month to discuss how their focus groups have yielded data. They then discussed how this data will inform the community action plan for Allen County. Moving forward, their focus is on specifics of the action plan and its implementation. Their next meeting will take place Dec. II at I PM at SCAN's Main Street office.

#### **LaGrange County**

LaGrange County PCA recently met to discuss several vital topics. They explored new training opportunities inspired by Shannon Seip's seminar, focused on preventing human trafficking and child sexualization in media. They also considered improving their social media presence for educational purposes, reviewed child-related policies such as corporal punishment, and planned upcoming panel presentations and bi-annual school open houses.

#### **DeKalb County**

The DeKalb County PCA recently met at The Children's First Center to review survey results and collected data from focus groups. Meggan Testin from the center played a crucial role in gathering client data, which will inform a comprehensive community action plan. The group also discussed participation in upcoming fall events like the Festival of Trees, a community holiday celebration. Their next meeting is scheduled for November 14th at 9:00 AM, once again at the Children's First Center.

#### **Steuben County**

The Steuben Co. PCA did not meet this summer and recently convened to discuss what they would like the PCA Council to look within the next upcoming season. They discussed local efforts to connect to events like Cops for Kids, and how that turns into events helping families in need during the holdiay season. They also discussed data that they have collected so far from focus groups. Their next meeting is on November 6th @12:00, located at the Steuebn County Community Center Foundation.

### A Glance At SCAN's Region 4 Impact

### **Impact Story**

SCAN has recently been working with a survivor of domestic violence. Her children had been removed from her care prior to working with SCAN, and she requested to work on parenting and co-parenting after she completed her domestic violence work.

Upon completion of this work, she went to court to bring her children home. At the first court hearing, DCS, as well as the GAL were in favor of the children being returned, however, the judge did not allow it until the trauma assessments were completed. During the second court hearing, the children were returned to their mother's care! She requested to continue to work with a little while longer with Family Connections so that she has a support while the children transition back into the home (which is a new home for them since mom moved to a better place) and she is working on routines, family rules, consequences and rewards for the children.

# Substance Misuse Initiative News

**SCAN's first Substance Free Alternative** Event (SFAE), funded in part by the **CRRSA Capacity Grant awarded to SCAN** by the Division of Mental Health and Addiction (DMHA), took place at the 13-24 Drive-In in Wabash on September 30 and was attended by nearly 200 people, the **Wabash County Tobacco Free Coalition** and the Bowen Center. SFAEs are social and recreational activities for youth and their families that specifically exclude the use of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs. These events are a fun way for families to bond with each other, as well as to engage with members of their community, for free or at a low cost. In addition, SCAN and the other organizations shares about their services.

### Region 3 Local Prevention Dollar Updates

Family and Children's Center offers a free program where parents can learn to interact with their infant or young children in new ways! The Brain Train is focused on promoting engagement between the parent and child to meet developmental milestones, build positive relationships, become educated on age-appropriate play and safety precautions, and provide community resources for each family. Lutheran Social Services of Indiana's Gear-Up for Safety Program provides families with necessary safety items, such as Pack 'N Plays, car seats, baby locks, smoke detectors and more. The Gear-Up program was able to help three families with safety items to ensure their little ones are safe in their home.



#### Wells County PCA Council Update

### **Community Partners Updates**

#### Region 3

Community Partners was able to assist twelve different families in September with financial assistance to avoid evicitons and disconnections of utilities.

#### Region 4

Four families were assisted in September with food and utility payments. At the same time period, three families were assisted with extermination services.



#### Region 6

Community Partners started working with a self-referred family who was struggling with a high electric bill and one parent looking for employment. The family could not find assistance from three local agencies. SCAN and Lutheran Social Services of Indiana were able to work together to provide financial assistance from both agencies to cover an electric bill of more than \$2,000 to avoid a disconnection.



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
